Board of Health Comes to Camp Springs to Launch an Initiative for Senior Citizens

Prince George's County's Board of Health announced a new program for senior citizens called "Mednovate Connect – Senior Telepharmacy Project". Telepharmacy connects the patient and pharmacy through either computer, audio, or video link telecommunication.

The Board of Health came to the Camp Springs Senior Center in Camp Springs in April to launch the program. "Mednovate Connect –uses telecommunications technologies to connect seniors living independently in Prince George's County with clinical pharmacists to deliver direct pharmaceutical care. The Laurel-Beltsville Senior Center, and the St. Paul Senior Residents Housing in Capitol Heights are also program sites.

Turn Down the Volume

The warm weather invites spring flowers and more outdoor activity. The outdoor activity will bring increased noise. While you're enjoying cookouts and parties with your family and friends, be respectful of your neighbors and turn down the volume of your music, especially after 10 pm. Police may fine people who are playing music in their home or car when someone who is at least 50 ft away from them can hear the noise. A police officer has the discretion to decide if the noise is a nuisance. The fines now range from \$100- \$250.

Camp Springs Civic Association participated in its third comprehensive clean-up. During the clean up, the Dept. of the Environment inspects houses for code violations such as peeling paint, unkept lawns, firewood stored on the ground, and fences, sheds, swimming pools, or porches in disrepair They also inspect for broken or missing windows, rodents on the premises. Homeowners are cited for commercial vehicles on residentially zoned property and operating vehicle repair businesses on residential property. Bulky trash was collected, storm drains were cleaned, and trees trimmed where needed. The results are listed below:
